# What are the main themes at COP28

- 1. Transitioning to clean energy** - Fast tracking the energy transition and slashing emissions before 2030 to limit global warming to 1.5° C (2.7° F) above pre-industrial levels.
- 2. Centering nature, people, lives & livelihoods** - Put nature, people, lives and livelihoods at the heart of climate action, including helping the most vulnerable communities adapt to the change that's already occurring.
- 3. Delivering on finance** - Deliver old promises and set the framework for a new deal on finance. Climate finance must be affordable, available, and accessible to developing countries.
- 4. Mobilizing inclusivity** - Mobilize the most inclusive COP ever, ensuring that decisions and discussions, and how the solutions are implemented, are truly inclusive and done in collaboration with Indigenous Peoples and local communities.

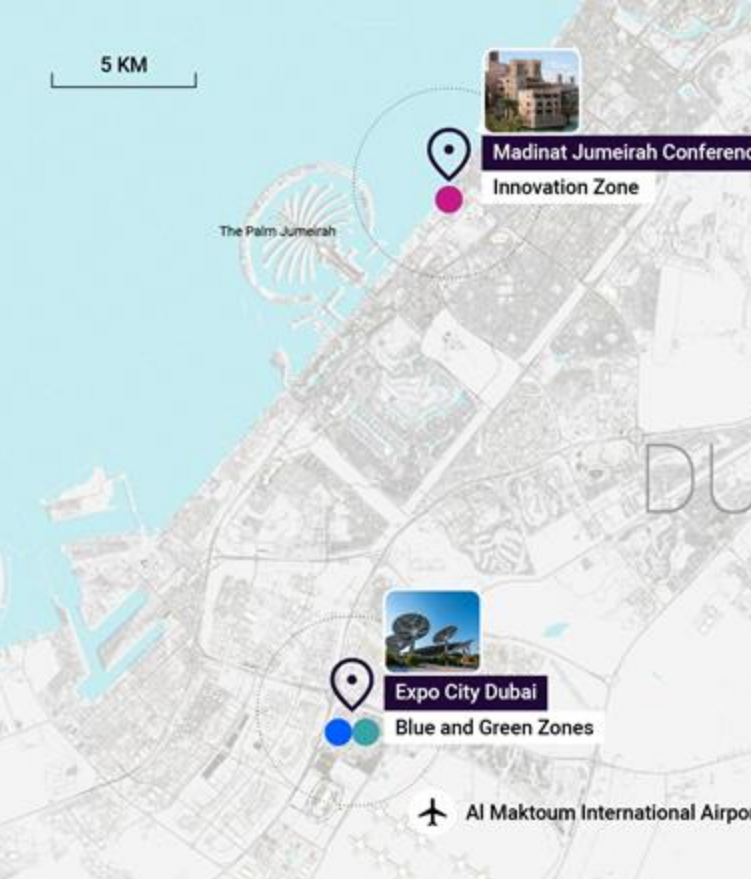

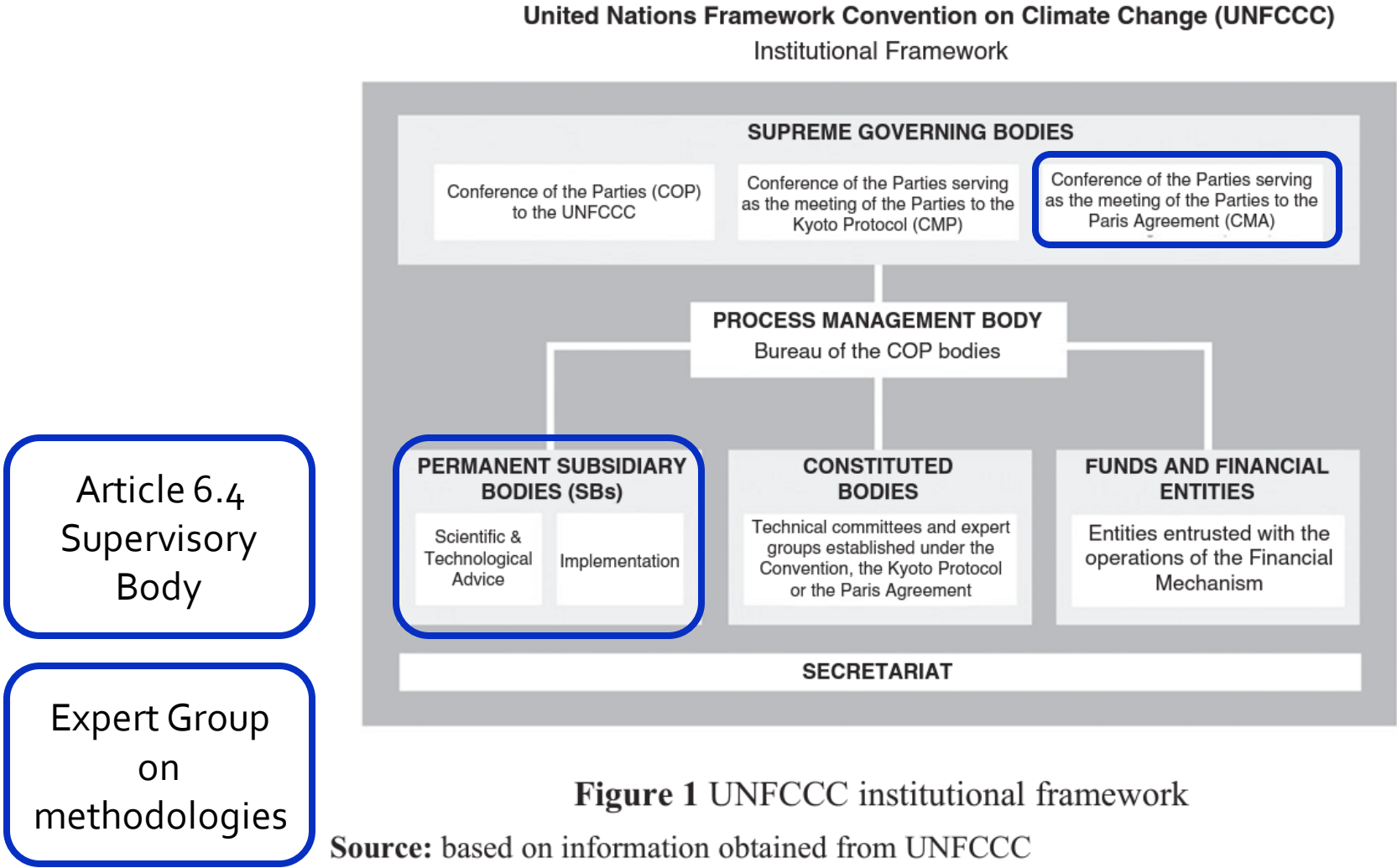
